## **DIRECTIONS FOR UPLOADING/SAVING YOUR ASSIGNMENTS TO YOUR ENGLISH 9 FOLDER ON OFFICE 365:**

To create/save documents in your English 9 folder:

1. Login to Office 365. Message me if you can't remember your login.
2. Click on One Drive (the cloud icon)
3. Click on your English 9 folder
4. Click 'New+' then 'Word Document'
5. Change the title to reflect the assignment you're working on

If you've already typed your assignments on regular Word on your computer:

1. Login to Office 365
2. Click on One Drive
3. Click on your English 9 folder
4. Click 'Upload' then 'files' and find the document(s) on your computer
5. Change the title to reflect the assignment you're working on

If you've handwritten or drawn your assignments:

1. Take photos of the assignments (on a phone or a camera)
2. Upload them to a computer (using a charging cord or memory card)
3. Login to Office 365 (on the same computer you uploaded the photos)
4. Click on One Drive
5. Click on your English 9 folder
6. Click 'Upload' then 'files' and find the pictures/documents on your computer
7. Change the title to the name of the assignment

OR

1. Download the One Drive app on your phone
2. Open the app and login
3. Click on your English 9 folder
4. Click the camera icon at the bottom
5. Take photos of your handwritten assignments and submit
6. Make sure you change the titles to reflect the assignment

OR

1. Take photos of your handwritten assignments on your phone's camera
2. Download the One Drive app on your phone
3. Open the app and login
4. Click on your English 9 folder
5. Click the + at the top, click 'Upload' then 'Photos and Videos' and find the pictures on your phone and submit
6. Make sure you change the titles to reflect the assignment



## Group Job Hierarchy

(Hint: on a Word document, you can click the ‘insert’ tab, click ‘table’ and choose how many rows and columns you want. This might help you create your hierarchy if you choose 5 rows and 2 columns.)
